She certainly appreciated her snacks. Something about Audrey that stood out to me is she did her best to be content with her living situation, her physical state, and stay positive when life's circumstances were less than ideal. It was hard not to cheer for her to walk again because she wanted to so badly. Especially after she made such a huge recovery a year and a half ago after head/brain surgery. When visiting her last summer, I could not believe she was the same woman struggling to make it back in February. Audrey was a very special woman to me. Even after I transferred to another building, we still kept in touch. She met my husband when we came to visit. She often asked if we would be having children in the near future, saying how much she enjoyed raising her own. I know she appreciated our friendship in the last 2 years, but she has made a lasting impression on me for life. I'm terribly sorry for the family's loss. I will miss her greatly.
