



Diane Groesch

October 2, 1938 - February 8, 2014

Diane May Groesch, 75 of Oswego, passed away February 8th, 2014 at Kindred Hospital of Sycamore surrounded by her loving family. She was born October 2, 1938 in Aurora, IL.

Diane was a member of St. Patrick Church in Yorkville. She was a member of the St. Patrick "Lady Knights" and the ladies auxiliary. Formerly, she was a longtime member of St. Mary Church in Aurora. She was also passionate about the "Our Lady's Rosary Makers" organization through which she created thousands of rosaries that were distributed to Catholic missions around the world. Diane was also a faithful member of the Fox Valley Animal Welfare League in Aurora. She was employed by the United States Postal Service for twenty-five years until her retirement in 1993.

Survivors include her brother, Lawrence L. (Martha) Groesch of DeKalb, IL; two sisters, Sally Ann (Raymond) Treve of North Aurora, IL and Georgieann C. Groesch of Oswego, with whom she lived with her entire life; ten nieces and nephews, Mike Treve Tara Treve; Matthew Groesch, Mary (Groesch) Edwards and David Groesch; and Zach, Christopher, Anthony Groesch, Vanessa (Groesch) Orman and Matthew Hartman; and thirteen great nieces and nephews.

She was preceded in death by her brother, John H. Groesch and by her parents Henry J. and Marcella R (May) Groesch.

Funeral services will be Tuesday, February 11, 2014 from 9:15 am at THE DALEIDEN MORTUARY to St. Patrick Church, Yorkville at 10:00 am. Fr.

Matthew Lamoureau, MIC will officiate.

Visitation will be Monday, February 10, 2014 from 3:00 pm until 8:00 pm with a Rosary service at 3:00 pm. Interment will be private.

“ Thank you to all the people who have posted their kind thoughts here. Aunt Diane was always game for fun- she was a big kid in many ways and that was one of the most endearing things about her. She loved her nieces and nephews, adopting a few close family friends' children along the way too. No one was ever jealous because Diane found great joy in helping raise all of us kids, which included the generation after us. Whether it was fishing, toting us around to our games to cheer us on, or burying Easter eggs in the tallest patch of grass she could find in the yard, Diane loved making us happy and traveled great lengths to see us. She documented a lot as well- she loved video taping us as we played, sang, and ran around the big back yard.

I have many fond memories of Aunt Diane, but one that I most cherish is one that is as much a feeling or impression left on my heart; experienced while I was quite young:

Undoubtedly an amalgam of the many nights we got to spend with our Aunts, when it was time for us to get to sleep, my sister would follow Aunt Georgie upstairs and I would crash in Aunt DiDi's bed. I don't know if Diane ever realized it, but I would often wake up late at night- or early in the dark morning- to the sounds of the oncoming diesel engine headed down the tracks that border their back yard and the Caterpillar plant behind them. Diane and Georgieann didn't have air conditioning so the windows were always open on those warm summer nights which allowed the sounds of the whistle to alert me to engine's presence. Silhouetted by the amber glow of the parking lot lamps, that train would slowly chug past as I peered out Diane's second floor window from the foot of her bed. "Where was it going?" I would think. "Where did it come from? ...Did the engineer have any thought that someone knew he was there?"

At once I was all alone with my imagination in the dark- the only one aware of that passing train- but at the same time, safe and loved by my slumbering Aunt right next to me. Eventually I would drift off and then wake to bright sunshine, breakfast, and a fun-filled Saturday

with my Aunts Diane and Georgieann. That was summer break for a six year old and I wouldn't trade it in for the world.

I miss you, Aunt Diane. I hope you know how much I love you. And how much of an impact you've had on my life.
