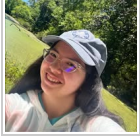

“ Dorothy will always hold a special place in my heart for all she has done for me growing up. She would get so upset at me for coming over every time it snowed a lot so I could shovel her driveway and then get upset if I didn't accept payment. She figured out she can give me snacks though! I was really little when I first met her. I learned she was an amazing painter and loved Disney. She introduced me to Cane's (she loved going there for chicken fingers! She didn't appreciate me refusing to try to coleslaw), Dairy Queen (she used to take Enzel there for pup cups! They would memorize her car just to get him one), and Pancake house (the staff loved her. They would come by and chat with us while we ate. She introduced me to chocolate chip pancakes). She let me come to her house every day afterschool to chat, run with Enzel, Lucy, and Sadie... we would play solitaire too! She had so much patience while teaching me. One time she gifted my family and I a bucket of caramel popcorn. None of us had had it before so the color made us think it was fake and that it was decorative popcorn. Until she asked us how it was and I realized... well shoot! I realized that day that caramel popcorn is the best ever.



I remember when she first met Mister the cat. Jim and her insisted he was probably dumped because he was so friendly and kept begging to go inside. After a couple months Dorothy managed to talk Jim into letting her take in another animal! She was always so stubborn when it came to animals. She inspired me so much. When she invited me in to chat and watch while she organized her mail she had ranted about how animal shelters keep sending her cards asking for her to donate. In the cards they would send her quarters, dimes, pennies... claiming that just one quarter can save a horses life. She would tell me “I don't understand why they keep sending me this! They could have saved so many horses with these quarters”.

During the summer she would randomly call me and ask for mine and my friends help to help groom the dogs. One time we came by every day to clean her place of all the dirt, fur and stuff in her

kitchen. I took so much convincing for her to finally let us help. She was always so independent! I miss her.

Growing up she was my best friend. She probably didn't know it but she made a big influence in my life. She was so determined, stubborn and selfless when it came to helping others. Especially when it came to animals! Even when she wasn't feeling well she made sure the bird bath had water and the bird feeders were stocked up. Even now I still see all the little critters coming to her place for a treat. The day I left for bootcamp she gave me a big hug to see me off. She mailed to me while I was in there struggling. She didn't have to but she took time out of her day to help someone who wasn't related to her. She built me up to be who I am now even if she didn't realize it.

Her laugh and smile were so infectious.

May she rest well knowing she was loved and cherished by many. My condolences to her family. Just know she was such an amazing and kindhearted woman.
