Ernst "Ernie" J. Biesemier, 89, of Aurora passed away Wednesday, June 27, 2012 at Rush-Copley Medical Center. He was born March 1, 1923 in Aurora, Illinois.

Ernie was a graduate of Marmion Military Academy in 1941. He was employed by Stevens Adamson for 45 years until his retirement.
