



## George Todas

October 26, 1924 - August 27, 2014

George Todas Jr. passed away on Wednesday, August 27th, 2014 at Jennings Terrace in Aurora, IL. He was born on October 26th 1924 in Aurora, IL.

George was one of seven children born to George Todas Sr. and Terezia Tamas Todas, both of Romanian descent. George grew up in Aurora and served in World War II as a Private First Class in the Army Air Corps, where he served in Italy. Following his honorable discharge in 1946, George had a long and distinguished career in the Aurora branch of the United States Post Office.

George was extremely active in Saint George Byzantine Catholic Church in Aurora, where he was a Cantor for 50 years. His charitable achievements include service in the Blue Army, and membership in a local crime-reduction group. George served the sick and elderly in the local nursing homes for many years with his cousin Mary Koskie. George's life was completely dedicated to Jesus Christ.

George is survived by his brother Nick Todus (Bev) of Aurora, his sister-in-law June Todas; and many nieces and nephews.

He is preceded in death by his parents George and Terezia, and 5 siblings: John, George, Mary Rita, Helen, and Lou.

Funeral from THE DALEIDEN MORTUARY will be Wednesday, September 3, 2014 at 9:30am to St. George Church at 10:00am. Fr. Frederick Peterson, OSB will officiate with interment at Lincoln Memorial Park.
