Joan used to say all the time "Why doesn't God take me!" " Why does He keep me here?" Maybe it was for all she taught us about faith in God and trust and in God and being old doesn't mean you lose your sense of humor and your wits. Joan was so brave and smart. My favorite line of hers is " I've outlived many a doctor". I don't know how I'm going to pass by McDonalds and not think of how much she loved chicken nuggets and sausage & egg biscuits. She loved her Vitamin Water. Most of her close family and close friends have passed away and Joan has been wanting to join them. Thanks to her friends she was able to stay in her home all but 5 days. Her wish was to die in her home which all but 5 days occurred. She died with dignity. NO IV's and no tubes and cold hospital room. She died in a nice ranch style home with friends frequently visiting. Joan was always on my husband's mind. "I have to cut the lawn for Joan" "Joan needs the trees trimmed" "Joan needs a new porch" "I need to get Joan's to clean out her gutters" "I have to get to Joan's to shovel her driveway". Whenever Joan had any problem with her TV remote to the pilot light going out to plumbing or electrical or annoying neighbors....Dan was there like a Super Hero to take care of it. She loved playing cards with my kids. She loved watching ice skating and the news and watching the Olympics. The morning after she died the sun was shining. I pray that Joan is so very happy in heaven with her family and her husband and her son . She no longer is in pain from her Shingles. She lived in pain every day with the Shingles and in these past months even more so and her legs hurt so much. She's in peace and no pain and I'm just so happy that she is happy. I will miss being able to stop by her house at any hour and her be sitting there in her recliner available to talk to me. I will miss her loving my husband and my kids and sharing that love with

me. I'm so glad I was privileged to know her and be affected by her.
