It was very early in the morning at my grandparents house while my family was living with them. We had an early morning medical emergency involving my younger brother. My grandparents were visibly shaken (even in the eyes of a pre-schooler) and I distinctly remember hearing something to the extent of, "call John, he'll know what to do." As a pre-schooler who was scared of everyone, I remember thinking, "Wow, Grandpa calls him for help!" That was a huge thought as I already thought Grandpa was the greatest person on the planet. I never imagined that he might call anyone for help. I think Uncle John must have run from his house a few blocks away to Grandma's house because there he was in the kitchen in what seemed like just moments. He immediately took control, calmed the adults, assessed the situation and then quickly took my brother and some other adults to the hospital. I can't even remember who went him to the hospital and who stayed with me; only that my grandparents had trusted him enough to call for help. Certainly everything was going to be alright. I have always loved him and regarded him with the utmost respect. He truly did make the world a better place and he will be greatly missed.*
