Jose G. Salazar, 76, of Yorkville, passed away most peacefully at home on Friday, August 19, 2011 after a long courageous battle with Parkinson's Disease. He was born August 27, 1934 in Harlingen, Texas to the late Martin and Dolores (Garcia) Salazar.
