Joseph "Joe" Ideran, age 93, passed away peacefully on March 22, 2017 surrounded by his family. Joe was born August 15, 1923 in Aurora, IL. He was married to his wife, Emma, for 63 years. He was a graduate of East Aurora High School and attended Northwestern University.

Joe was a WWII veteran and served in the 5th Air Force as an M.P. in the South Pacific. He retired from Aurora Pump Company after 38 years of service.

He was a member of St. Michael Romanian Byzantine Catholic Church, the Phoenix Club, and a life member of Post 7452 Veteran of Foreign Wars.

Joe was an avid golfer, who was an Aurora City Champion and winner of numerous golf tournaments. He was also a professional drummer and enjoyed music.
