Mary Ann (Kartheiser) Hamman, 96, of Aurora, passed away peacefully at her home on April 24, 2014. She was born on July 1, 1917 in Aurora. 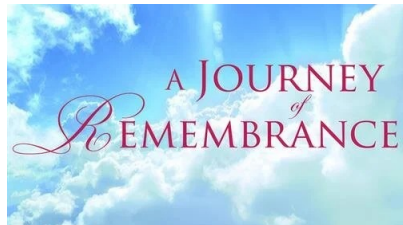
