Milton John Card, age 92, passed away on Friday, November 16, 2012 at HCR Manor Care in Naperville, IL. He was born August 2, 1920 in Decatur, IL.

Milton served his country during WWII in the United States Navy and was a Pearl Harbor survivor. Milton was a barber for over fifty years at Milt's Barber Shop and A & A Barber Shop. He was an avid fisherman and gardener.

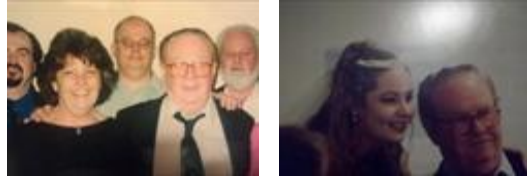

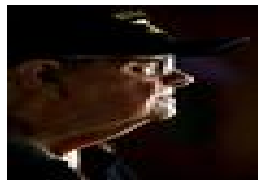

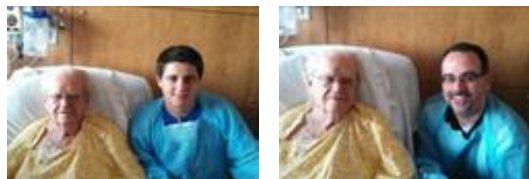
