Funeral services will be held privately for the immediate family. A memorial service will be held for friends and family at a later date

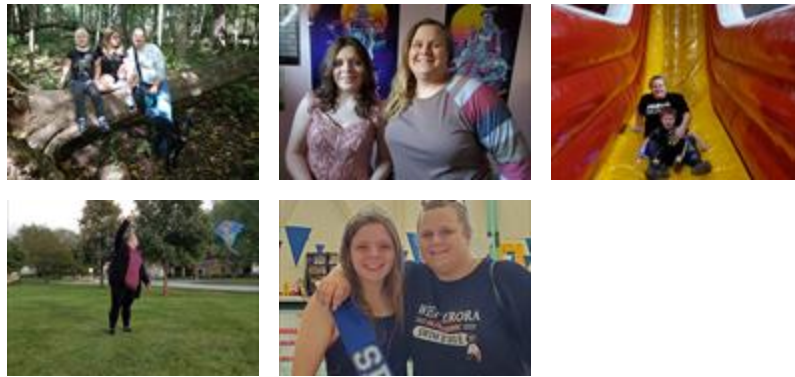
