While Susan was happy in her Microbiology work at Swedish Covenant Hospital for several years she disliked the drive and she was so happy when she found her way in Rush Copley which was just several minutes from our house. My career in IT was a roller coaster ride but only the ride up was the fun part and the ride down was more than humbling. I know I couldn't have made it all through the struggles without her strength.
