



Worling "Woody" Hulting

March 23, 1921 - January 3, 2017

Worling "Woody" Hulting, 95, of Aurora, passed peacefully into eternity on Tuesday, January 3, 2017 in Aurora, Illinois.

Worling Wallace Hulting was born in Geneseo, IL to Wallace and Lyla Hulting on March 23, 1921. He was a graduate of Geneseo High School. After graduating from Augustana Business College in Rock Island, IL, he proudly enlisted in the Army to serve in World War II from 1942 – 1945 in the 518th Ordnance Heavy Maintenance Company Field Artillery Unit. He is credited with serving in five campaigns, including Normandy, Northern France, Ardennes, Rhineland and Central Europe. After discharge, he thoroughly enjoyed a lifelong career as a professional salesman in several states encompassing many interesting territories, including Chicago's South Side. He dedicated 45 years of his employment to Reynolds and Reynolds of Dayton, OH. He served the Lord enthusiastically in many different ministries during his membership at First Presbyterian Church of Aurora.

Worling is survived by his wife, C. Joy; his children, Lee Hulting (Janice) of the Chicago area, Lynn Hulting (Tom Dreischarf) of Miamisburg, OH and Jane Hulting (John Wood) of Sugar Grove, IL; stepchildren, Lynn Hamlin (Jeff Stutes) and Sue Hamlin Harrison, all of Aurora; nine grandchildren; and fourteen great grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his first wife, Meredith; and his step-son-in-law, Daniel Harrison.

There will be no visitation. A memorial celebration of Woody's life will be held at 1:00 PM on Saturday, January 14, 2017 at First Presbyterian Church, 325 E. Downer Place, Aurora, IL.
